25 November 1968

Investigation by the Claims Office reveals that the following damages to private property was caused by the explosion of a B-52 aircraft at the northeast end of the runway at Kadena AB, Okinawa at about 0400 hours, 19 Nov 1968.

██████████ Broken reinforced glass windows; owner complaining of structural damage because building has many cracks.  
Estimated Damage: ██████████

██████████ wner of three houses rented to Americans, Apartment building with American renters, and business offices and contractor storage area. Houses severely damaged in that windows blown out and frames broken. Windows in apartment and business buildings broken. Other miscellaneous damage. ESTIMATED DAMAGE: ██████████

██████████ : Eleven homes in this category were moderately to severely damaged. Average loss including personal property such as broken bric-a-brac and cut drapes is estimated at ██████████  
ESTIMATED DAMAGE: \$ ██████████

██████████ very close to explosion; Four pieces of heavy equipment such as rollers were considered to have minor damage. However, the owners have presented an estimate including lost time and general overhaul that may not be valid in a total amount of ██████████

██████████ : Received minor damage to shutters and windows. A few have complained of cracks in cement buildings. This type of damage has not been confirmed. TOTAL ESTIMATED DAMAGE: ██████████  
(Three hundred at \$30 each.)
